Jenkinsville Community Water Project Construction Begins

QUEENSBURY – The Town of Queensbury today began installation of new water mains to bring municipal water service for the first time to the Jenkinsville area of the community. This is the first phase of a two-phase project.

The first phase construction work is being performed by a Queensbury contractor, Tom Kubricky Company Inc. (TKC). Kubricky submitted the lowest of six bids for the project, at \$3,376,159, and the contract award was approved by the Queensbury Town Board. The TKC bid was \$1.76 million less than the next lowest bid.

The work will begin on Mud Pond Road between Patten Mills Road and Azure Drive. It then will proceed along Jenkinsville Road to Old Cronin Road and continue to Rainbow Trail, Sunnyside Road and Sunnyside East, Stonehurst Drive, and then Ridge Road to Haviland Road.

TKC will install approximately 22,000 linear feet of water mains as well as hydrants and valves. TKC also will restore lawns, landscaping, driveways, and other areas that are affected by the work. Construction work will typically take place Monday through Friday, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. The Town has required the contractor to complete the work by the end of May 2027.

In the second phase of the project, service lines will be installed to connect the new mains to individual properties. The Town is expected to award a contract for the Phase 2 work in 2027.

The project is being overseen by C.T. Male Associates, the Town's engineering firm, and Queensbury Water and Wastewater Director Chris Harrington.

A New York State grant will cover 70 percent of the approximately \$6.3 million construction cost of the project. The overall cost is \$7.7 million, including engineering, construction, administration, legal and other non-construction costs.

When the project is completed, public water service will be available for the first time to approximately 176 parcels, including 146 residential properties. The project is divided into two zones. Zone 1 generally encompasses areas of Jenkinsville where New York State tests showed possible contamination in some private drinking water wells. The approximately 88 properties in Zone 1 are required to connect to the new town water mains. Properties in Zone 2, also numbering approximately 88, would have the opportunity to connect to municipal water but not be required to do so.
